

- Example: Member joins as a junior. Instead of 70 points for the year, it would be 80 points



O5 Competitions



Social Studies UIL

Each High School consists of a Social Studies UIL Team who compete in these competitions where they can earn awards and recognition.

Current Event

Tests competitors on their knowledge on real-world current events



Social Studies

Requires competitors to read a historical book and test upon its contents and context

World Historian Student Essay Competition

Write an essay about how the learning world history affected the understanding of the world you live in Due: May 1, 2022

Essay

Can be written about any historical topic And can be made short (1,500 - 2,500) OR long (4,000 - 6,000). Must include Turabian endnotes and bibliography Due: By end-of-year

National History Day

Each year, National History Day frames students' research within a historical theme wherein the end, they create a project that displays their chosen topic that correlates with the theme. Members have the potential to go to the national round, win the competition or even win scholarship money. The 2021 - 2022 theme is *Debate & Diplomacy in History:*Successes, Failures, Consequences.



Deadline

The project is due January 11, 2022

- Can be done individually or as a team (2-5 people)
 - Members can earn extra credit in history classes when competing
 - Extra points awarded if members advance to regionals or state rounds
- Members are to create projects of either category
 - Website, Performance, Documentary, Poster, Individual Paper
 - Must include an annotated Bibliography, Process Paper, and Thesis Statement to be submitted separately
